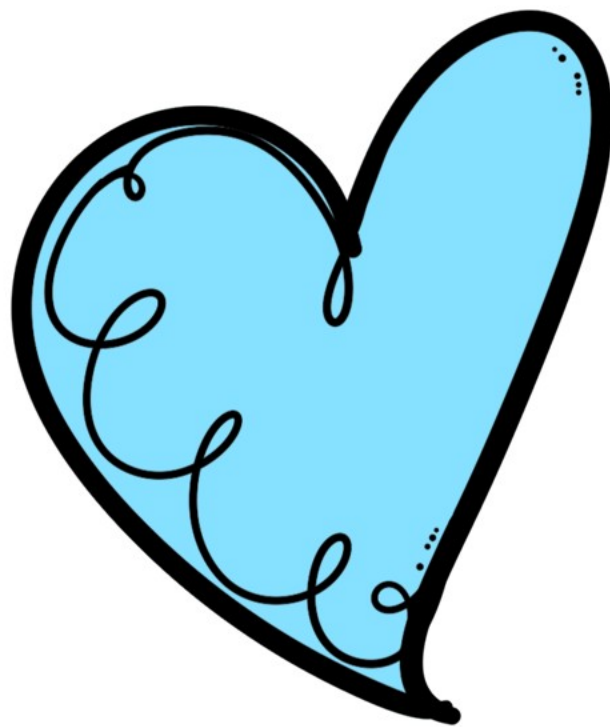


Thanksgiving Quilt



DIRECTIONS

- Discuss with students- everything that they are thankful for - at school, at home, about themselves, family, friends, etc.
- Give each student a quilt square. You can differentiate by giving the students squares with less or more writing areas based on their ability.
- Students should write what they are thankful for - anywhere on their square - in pencil. Depending on age and ability, you could tell them to write 3 things, or for younger students one or two. They can draw pictures too.
- Students should trace over their writing with a black pen, if possible.
- Color in the entire square, background and all.
- Cut out, cutting around the dotted lines for the tabs.

ASSEMBLY

- Decide what shape quilt you want – square or rectangle.
- How many squares did your students make? Decide how many rows and columns you will have.
- Begin at the left, top corner. It doesn't matter what order you put them in. Put glue on the right tab and put the next square on top of the tab. Keep going until you have your top row. The last one in the row, cut off the right tab.
- For the next rows, you will glue them onto the bottom tab of the previous row.
- Fill in the rows with the extra coloring squares, as needed.
- For the bottom row, cut off the bottom tab.
- If you are displaying on a bulletin board, you could cut off all the tabs and just staple the squares next to each other.
- Enjoy your masterpiece!

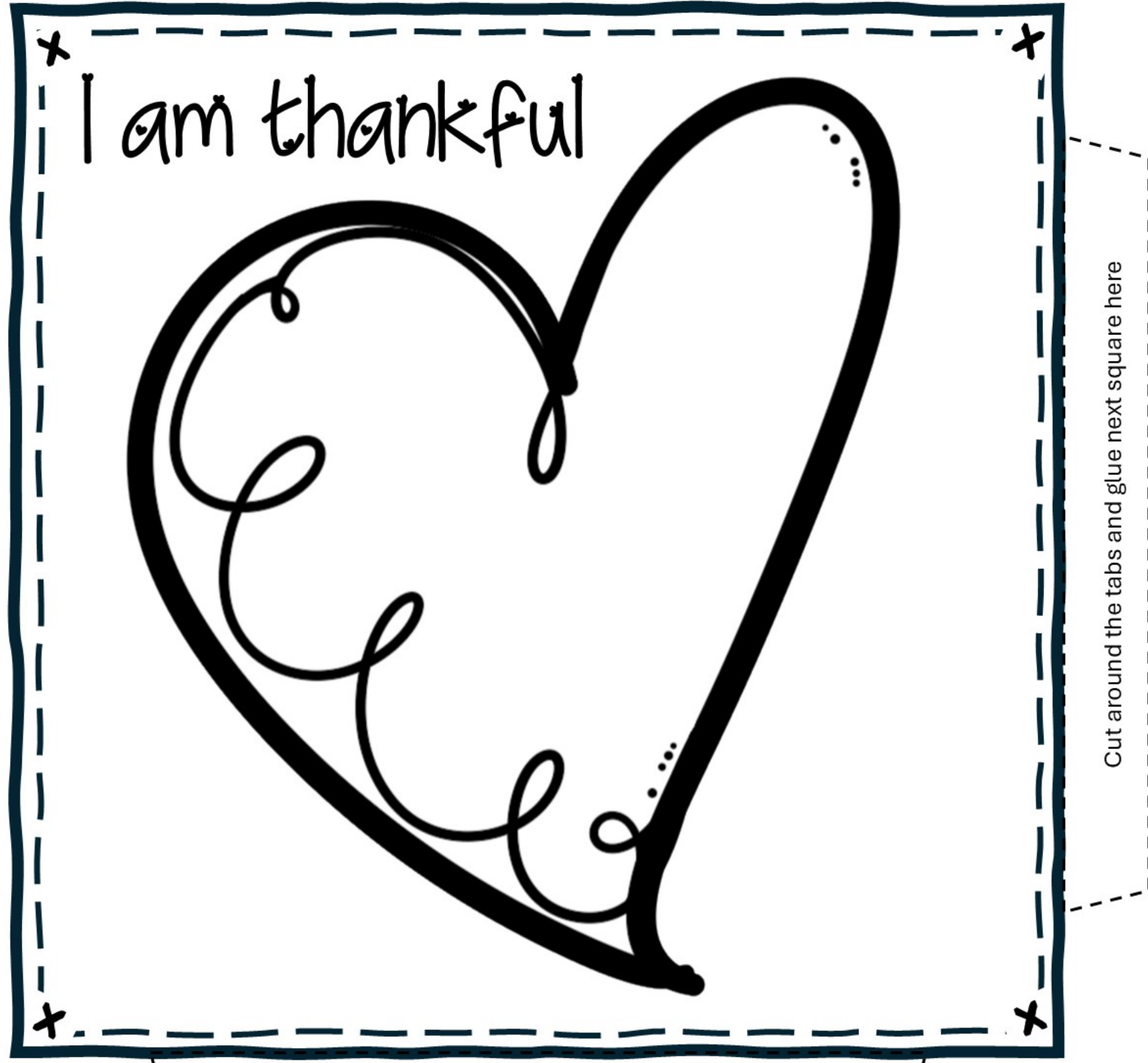


WHAT ARE WE THANKFUL FOR?

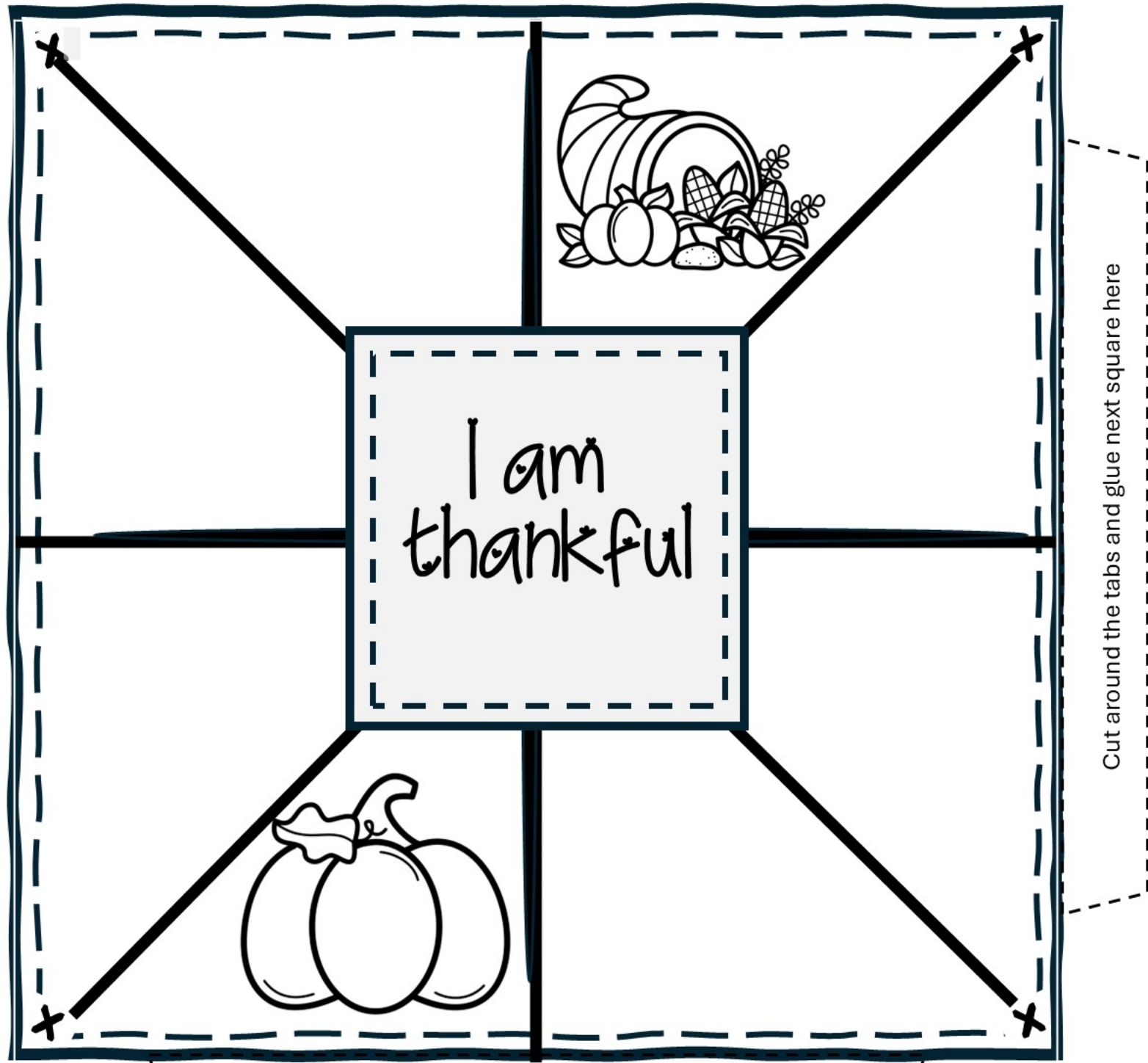
Think about what you are thankful for:

- ✓ Think of other ways that you can be thankful for the life you live.

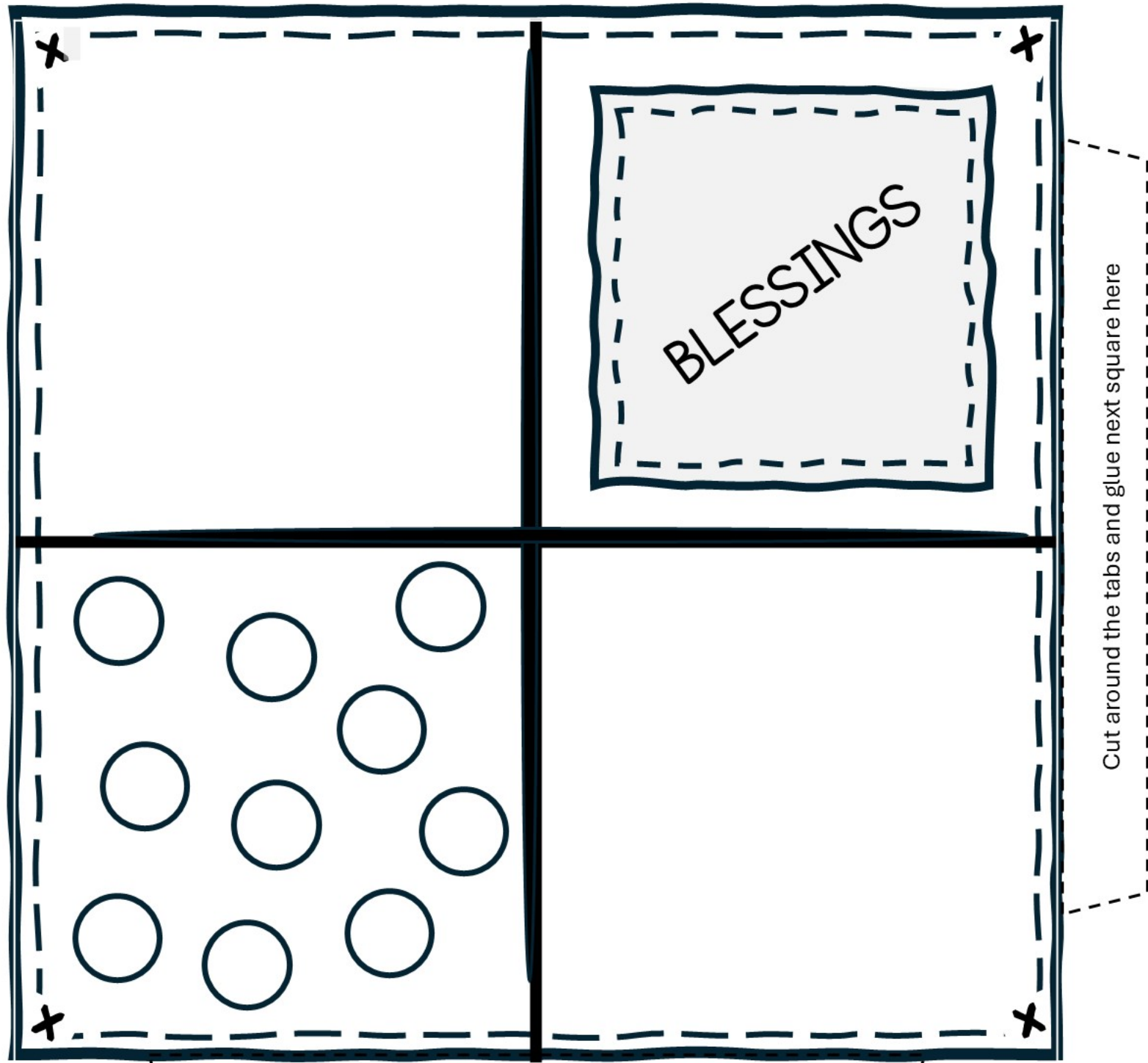

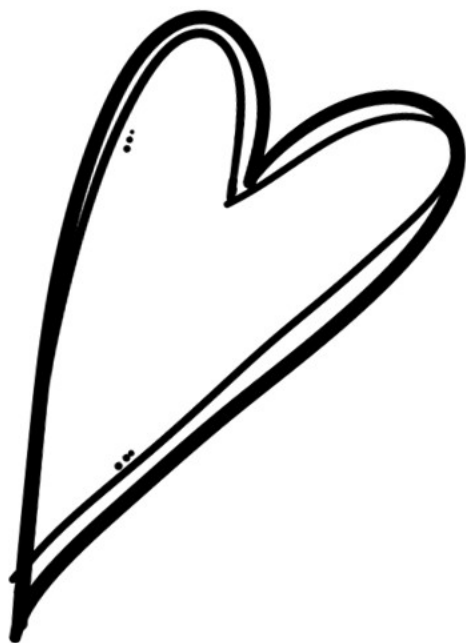

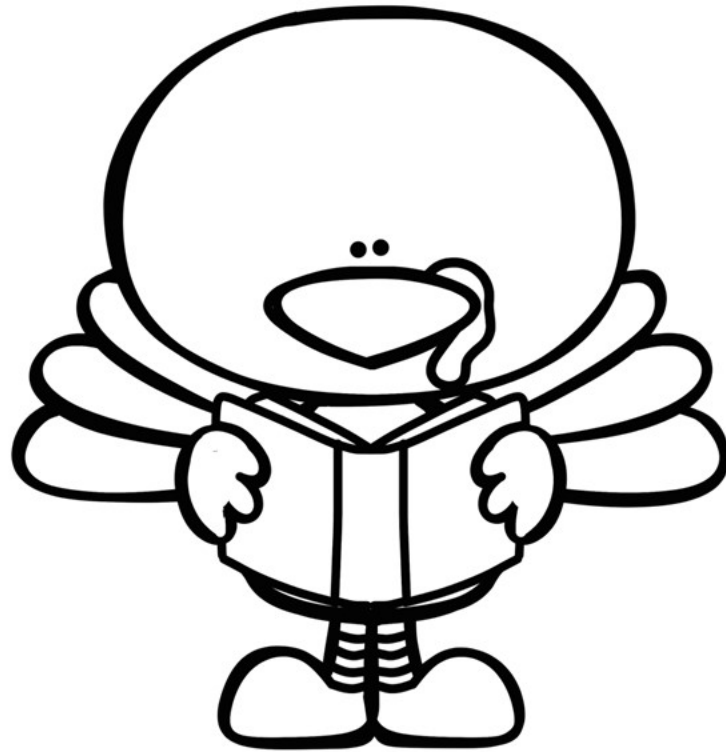
